Your Safety and The OIG

The Office of the Inspector General (OIG) is an independent agency who's stated goal is; "to help maintain confidence in the postal system and improve the Postal Service's bottom line through independent audits and investigations." It consists of the Office of Investigations and the Office of Audit. The Office of Investigations is pretty self explanatory. They investigate cases involving internal mail theft, narcotics, multiple types of fraud, and many other crimes. The Office of Audit is a little different in that they do exactly that. They audit. So how does that pertain to our safety?

The Office of Audit conducts audits of USPS operations to prevent fraud, waste, and misconduct and to promote economy, efficiency and effectiveness. During audits of facilities, hey have brought many safety issues to management's attention. Yes, I know that there are safety issues in many offices that can go unaddressed but when it's put in an OIG Audit report, they seem to be get some attention. There are pictures of some of the facility safety issues they have found and that have been fixed, along with lots more information, at uspsoig.gov.

So yes, the OIG can have a positive impact on workplace safety and so can you. Workplace safety should be important to us all. If you see something in your office that is unsafe, report it to a supervisor. If they fail to do something about it in a reasonable amount of time, we have other recourse. PS Form 1767, Report of Hazard, Unsafe Condition or Practice, can be filed in instances where local management fails to act. You can find the form online and they should be readily available at your facility along with instructions on how to file it and it can be filed anonymously if you feel the need to.

State convention is close upon us and I hope you are making you plans to attend. We have been working hard to plan productive and informative Convention.

We've been in contact with the OIG as well as the Postal Inspectors and have invited them to attend this year's convention. Hope to see you there.

What Difference Does A Union Make? Union

1. Wages, benefits and working conditions are protected by a legal contract.

A contract spells out how much each worker earns.

Unions negotiate raises for every one. Members vote on it, and if they feel it's an unfair, they can vote it down.

4. If you are unfairly disciplined, unions provide due process to protect against unscrupulous supervisors.

If you don't like something at work you can work together with your union to change it.

Non-Union

1. Management can change wages, benefits and working conditions unilaterally.

2. No one knows how much anyone else earns. Disparate treatment/favoritism exists.

3. If you want a raise you must plead your case to a supervisor or manager.

If you are unfairly disciplined, you are on your own (at-will employee). You're subject solely to policy.

If you don't like something at work, you are at the mercy of management.

Have A Retirement Account With A Former Employer?

Many carriers transitioned into the rural craft from a previous employer who may have offered retirement accounts. Rolling over eligible money from a previous employer or from an IRA can be confusing.

There are qualified professionals ready to help you with the process so you can keep your money invested for your retirement savings. Simply call the ThriftLine Service Center at 1-877-968-3778. Follow the prompts until you hear the Savings and Retirement option, and then choose the "Assisted Rollovers" option.

A rollover specialist will assist you throughout the process, including:

- Contacting the providers who administer the account(s) you wish to roll into the plan.
- Verifying that all paperwork is completed, correct, and in good order.
- Ensuring that the funds to be consolidated are properly directed to the plan.

What Types of Money Can Be Rolled Over?

- Pre-tax (taxable) amounts from an eligible employer plan. These are any amounts contributed to your account that you've not yet paid taxes on. This includes any pre-tax contributions, as well as the taxable earnings received on contributions to your account.
- Nontaxable Roth amounts from an eligible employer plan, direct rollover only.
- Roth amounts from an eligible employer plan, direct rollover only. These are amounts that you've contributed to a Roth account and already paid taxes on. It may also include the earnings received on the Roth contributions.
- Pre-tax (taxable) amounts from an IRA. You're responsible for ensuring that the rollover contribution you're making to the plan doesn't contain any after-tax (also known as nondeductible) amounts from an IRA.
- Repayments of COVID-Related Distributions of the same money types described can be made and are treated as rollovers into the plan. The

repayment must be less than or equal to the distribution amount and must be made to a plan that accepts rollovers or to an IRA within 3 years from the date of distribution. After 3 years, you're no longer eligible to make a repayment of any amount.

What Types of Money Can't Be Rolled Over?

- After tax (nontaxable) contributions from an eligible employer plan. These are amounts that you've already paid taxes on to a non Roth account. Note: Earnings on after tax contributions are considered a pre tax amount that will be taxable to you and are eligible for rollover.
- Amounts from a Roth IRA.
- After tax contributions you made to a traditional IRA (also referred to as nontaxable or nondeductible contributions).
- Amounts paid to you as part of a series of equal or almost equal payments that are made at least once a year and that will last for a) your lifetime (or your life expectancy), b) your lifetime and your beneficiary's lifetime (or your joint life expectancies); or c) a specified or expected period of ten or more years.
- Required minimum distribution payments.
- Hardship distributions.
- Payments made to you as a non-spouse beneficiary or a non-spouse alternate payee.
- Pass through dividend payments.
- Repayment of any COVID-Related Distribution if the date of distribution was more than 3 years ago.
- Repayments of COVID-Related Distributions of the same money types described.

So many details that it takes a professional to be able to answer correctly. For further information please go to tsp.gov.

If you ever experience an emergency, dial 911 immediately. But if you need medical care and it's not life- threatening, it pays to know your options.

Please use the chart on the next page as a guide to your health care.

As you can see, there are many features and values built into the RCBP. Choosing the right care setting can save you time and money!

I also want to encourage you to get your health screening at our upcoming State Convention. There are still spaces available so make your appointment now. Information on making your screening appointment is below.

Once you enter your information to confirm eligibility, select onsite event—*Harrah's Cherokee Resort*—and reserve your spot.

You may also call the Quest Service Center at 855-623-9355 and let them know of the event location *Harrah's Cherokee Resort* and sign up for a timeslot by phone.

Preregistration is required to receive your screening at the State Convention.

National Convention

National Delegate Election by Secret Ballot

This year the National Convention will be held in Grand Rapids, Michigan from August 15-18, 2023.

A secret ballot election for the delegates of the North Carolina RLCA to the 2023 NRLCA National Convention will be conducted by mail.

The deadline for delegate nominations has closed.

Ballots will be mailed to members between May 20 and May 25, 2023

Counting of the National Delegate ballots will take place on Saturday June 17, 2023 beginning at 10:00 AM at Harrah's Resort, at 777 Casino Drive, in Cherokee, NC 28719.

Any candidate or designee may observe the ballot tabulation.

In reporting the results of the election, the candidates shall be placed on the roster in the order of votes received. The number of delegates to which the state is entitled shall be declared regular delegates; the remaining candidates shall be declared alternates.

In the case of a tie vote, the tie will be broken with a blind drawing done by the Election Committee.



Didn 't Receive Your Ballot?

Any eligible member who does not receive a ballot or whom spoils a ballot may request a new ballot by contacting the Election Committee Chairperson, Debra Bennett at 910-436-6487. If you request and return another ballot, only the replacement ballot will be counted.

State Convention

The State Convention will be held at Harrah's Resort & Casino at 777 Casino Drive, Cherokee, NC 28719 on June 19 thru June 21, 2023 with the business session starting on Monday June 19. Complete address and reservation information for the State Convention can be found on the back page of this issue.

Elections for the positions of President, Vice-President (one year term), and Executive Committeeman (three year term) will be conducted on Wednesday June 21, 2023.

Included below are the rules for State delegates from the *North Carolina RLCA constitution*, Article VI.

Section 3. State Delegates.

- A. All districts shall be entitled to one delegate vote for each six paid-up members or a fraction thereof.
- B. No delegate shall represent more than one district.
- C. No district shall be represented in the State Convention by proxy.
- D. The total delegates from a district (if not in full attendance) may be voted by the one or more delegates in attendance.

She believes it an honor to serve her fellow auxiliary, association, and juniors' auxiliary members, and believes that the rural carriers provide a vital service to this country.

Appearing below is Article VI, Section 4 from the Constitution of the North Carolina Rural Letter Carriers' Association. This language was adopted at the 2019 State Convention in Raleigh.

This is the procedure put in place for our members to be compensated (paid) for attending the state convention as delegates.

Members must also be **elected to serve as delegates at the local meeting**; as per Article IV.

This complies with labor laws which require that delegates must be elected by a direct vote of the membership.

Mail the completely filled out and signed preregistration form to me. Please print clearly as an illegible registration may cause it to be to deemed unacceptable.

You must preregister to be eligible to receive payment as a delegate.

Forms may be copied and will also be

available on the website www.NCRLCA.org.

Please send in as early as possible.

ARTICLE VI, Section 4

State Delegate Compensation

- A. State delegates shall be compensated up to \$100.00 per each completed business session day of attendance at the State Convention for expenses.
- B. The state shall set aside a total amount equal to the rate of .00017% of a 40 hour, Step C, Table 1 regular rural carrier's yearly pay for each member on the rolls on June 30, to be used to pay state delegates. (proviso first deposit will be July 2019)
- C. These funds shall be held in an interestbearing account.
- D. The maximum amount to be paid out per

FYI ~ Driving to the State Convention

Most GPS systems will send you to Cherokee from I-40 via Highway 19. This route is shorter mileage wise but it is a narrow, winding road through the mountains. It is a beautiful, scenic route and will get you to Cherokee just fine, just at a much slower pace.

You can also get to Cherokee via Hwy 74/ Hwy 23/Great Smoky Mountain Expressway and then take Hwy 441 North into Cherokee (*do not take Exit 103 to Maggie Valley & Cherokee – stay on US 74 until Exit 74 onto Hwy 441N*) This way is a little longer in miles but is a nice wide road and has a higher speed limit. It is still a pretty a ride but is definitely not as narrow & winding as Highway 19.

Make sure you **park and check-in at the Cherokee Convention Center** and not the at the original Harrah's Resort. The Cherokee Center has a separate entrance with it's own parking garage. If you park in in the original facility you will have a long walk to your room and the convention.

Things To Do In Cherokee

Besides all the convention events there are several fun, free and interesting things to do in Cherokee.

In Cherokee you can enjoy many outdoor activities. There are hiking trails and rock climbing. You can visit swimming holes and waterfalls. Go fishing, kayaking, tubing, or whitewater rafting on the rivers.

There are even several elk that can be spotted grazing in the fields near the Oconaluftee Visitor Center on Highway 441. You may see them on your drive in!

Another fun & free activity is to hunt for the painted bears that are all over the town. In an effort to highlight Tribal artists, several Eastern Band of Cherokee artists have created a series of large, life-like fiberglass bears and painted them in bright vibrant colors and designs. Bears are a large part of the Cherokee culture. According to Cherokee legend, black bears are the keepers of dreams. They are placed throughout the streets of Cherokee. There are currently 19 bears completed. 25 bears have been commissioned. Each is a work of art. There is one at Harrah's resort.

To learn about the history and culture of the Cherokee people visit one of these spots.

- <u>"Unto These Hills"</u>: is one of the most popular things to do in Cherokee. You'll be moved and transported back in time as you watch the story of the Cherokees unfold before your eyes. This is an outdoor drama. There is a preshow at 7:30 p.m. and the show starts at 8:00 p.m. nightly, except Sundays.
- Oconaluftee Indian Village: take a trip in a time machine and transport yourself back to a recreated village from 1760.
- Qualla Arts and Crafts Mutual, Inc.: see authentic Cherokee arts and crafts as they're created: bead working, pottery, stone carving, wood carving, basketry, finger weaving and more.
- Museum of the Cherokee Indian: learn about the fascinating heritage, history and culture of the Cherokees.
- Cherokee Veterans Park: is dedicated to all members of the Eastern Band of Cherokee who have served honorably in the Armed Forces of this great nation. It has many interesting statues and memorials.

GUIDELINES FOR SELECTION OF OUTSTANDING MEMBER OF THE YEAR

I. Method of Selection

1. Nomination of candidates for the award shall be made prior to the State Convention. Nominations may be made directly from the members inviting such nominations. Also, local, county or district units may select candidates for the award.

2. In either event, the name of the candidate should be submitted, with a brief resume of accomplishments, to a Selection Committee to be named by the State Board, or by any other means, which may be the prevailing policy in the State Association.

II. Eligibility for Award

1. Any MEMBER of the Association may be nominated as a candidate for the Outstanding Member of the Year Award.

2. State Association Officers should not be arbitrarily selected for the award nor should they be eliminated from consideration. Officers have been chosen to lead and serve, but it is frequently demonstrated that their services go far beyond the routine duties of the office and, thus may be worthy of selection.

III. Criteria for Selection

1. The primary consideration of the Selection Committee shall be:

(a) The service rendered by the candidate to the Rural Letter Carriers' Association;

(b) Attendance and participation in local, state and national meetings;

(c) Willingness to accept responsibilities and dedication in performing those duties;

(d) Fraternal Attitude to others of the Rural Carrier Craft.

2. The Selection Committee should also consider, as a secondary matter, other service which the candidate may have rendered, such as civic and community activities, which reflect favorably upon the Rural Letter Carrier Craft and the Postal Service.

3. Consideration shall be given for services rendered in the immediately preceding twelve-month period, but not completely limited to this period of time. New carriers should be encouraged to seek to achieve this award.

IV. Presentation of Award

When each State Association has made its selection, the name of the candidate shall be reported to the

National Office by the State Secretary on the regular Annual Report. An appropriate award will be presented

by the National Rural Letter Carriers' Association at its National Convention.

V. Other

These guidelines are not intended to be binding and a State may use any other selection procedure that is suitable for each State.

The announcement of the recipient of the award will be made at the banquet at the State Convention. The State Secretary shall report the name to the National Office and the award will be presented at the National Convention with State presentation at the Fall Booster.

This year the State Board has appointed the immediate past three recipients of the award to serve as the Selection Committee.

Social Security Fairness Act

The repeal and elimination of the Government Pension Offset (GPO) and Windfall Elimination Provision (WEP) has enjoyed large bipartisan support in Congress, but passage has remained elusive. Both GPO and WEP unfairly reduce Social Security benefits earned by rural letter carriers, as well as other federal and postal employees who are impacted by these two provisions. Congress has the power to correct this injustice by passing the bipartisan H.R. 82, the Social Security Fairness Act.

Federal employees covered by the Civil Service Retirement System (CSRS), retiring December 1982 and later, are affected by the Government Pension Offset. The GPO reduces or eliminates the Social Security spousal or survivor benefits for which a federal retiree may be eligible based on the Social Security record of his or her spouse. One of the rules of the Social Security system is that a person cannot receive both his/her own earned benefit plus a full spousal benefit. Therefore, a retiree's Social Security "spousal" benefit is cut by an amount equal to twothirds of the retiree's CSRS annuity.

In 1983, Congress created the Windfall Elimination Provision, which changed the formula for computing Social Security benefits to provide a higher return for low wage-earning workers. The WEP reduces the Social Security benefit of those who receive an annuity from an employment system in which they did not pay Social Security taxes. WEP impacts roughly two million public employees by reducing their benefits by as much as \$512 per month.

Both GPO and WEP unfairly penalize rural letter carriers and other postal and federal retirees who chose to pursue a career in public service. These provisions can drastically reduce a retiree's income at a time when many are struggling to make ends meet. Both provisions should be eliminated and allow postal and federal retirees all of the benefits they have earned while working in public service.

The NRLCA supports the repeal and the elimination of the WEP and GPO provisions and urges Members of the House to co-sponsor H.R. 82.

Representative Davis is my member of Congress and proof that writing letters does make a difference.

Everyone wanted this bill passed and the conversation stayed on this topic for some time with many of those present commenting. Rep. Manning promised to go back to Washington and cosponsor this bill. She was good to her word and did.

Please write or call your member of Congress. Continue to ask the other ten members of the NC delegation to cosponsor this bill and thank the four that already have.

The total number of Cosponsor has reached 223. Now we need to encourage the Speaker to put this bill on the agenda and bring it to the floor for a vote.

Health Insurance for RCAs

As a Rural Carrier Relief (RCA) you only have access to one Health Care plan with the USPS.

The USPS HEALTH BENEFITS PLAN: This health benefit plan is available to all non-career RCAs (ARCs do not quality under the plan).

You must sign up for health insurance within 60 days of your hire date. If you miss this deadline then you will have to wait for open season or have a qualifying life event to enroll. Open season is during November-December every year. Watch for actual dates to be announced as we get closer to November.

Carefirst Blue Cross Blue Shield is the new plan administrator for the USPS Health Benefit Plan.

The Rates listed next are per pay period:

Self only \$48.50

RCA ER CORNER

Self plus one \$110.25

Self and Family \$156.00.

The health insurance copayment by the USPS is a fairly recent benefit for RCAs negotiated into our contract by the union.

Converting from RCA to Career Carrier

An important fact to know is that if you are converting from non-career (RCA) to a career carrier (PTF or Regular Carrier), the Non-Career insurance will end 28 days after the date of your conversion.

As a new career carrier you have 60 days to choose a new health insurance plan rom the many offered by USPS, including the Rural Carrier Benefit Plan that is just for union members.

If you do not want a lapse in coverage you will need to select your insurance within 28 days. This is spelled out in the packet you will receive in the mail with the new insurance choices.

Life insurance, the Federal Employees' Group Life Insurance (FEGLI) through USPS is only available for the first 60 days after you make career carrier as well.

All career employees are automatically enrolled in a basic life insurance plan which is your annual salary rounded up to the next \$1,000 plus \$2,000 at no charge to you.. You may elect to get more, from 2 times up to 5 times your salary for a nominal fee. This is a one time chance.

The USPS has **no open season** for life insurance, and almost never lets you acquire any additional life insurance later on. If you need life insurance you should get it within those 60 days. You can

always decrease your coverage but you can't get any more through USPS after that initial 60 day window.

One more thing to be aware of, all new career employees are automatically enrolled into a Thrift Savings Plan.

Five percent of your base pay as a new career carrier is automatically withheld from

your pay and deposited into a TSP account each pay period.

The Postal Service also deposits a five percent "matching" contribution. This breaks down as an automatic one percent deposit regardless of your contribution with an additional four precent matching payment. This is a total deposit of 10% of your base salary being deposited into a TSP account from day one as a career carrier.

You can choose to increase, decrease or eliminate this level of contribution but you must deposit 5% to get a matching 5% from the USPS.

Where Is The Data?

In the blink of an eye, here we are coming up on the half-way point of 2023. I can say with complete confidence that the last 6 months of RRECS has gone about as smoothly as the previous 11 years. The frustration that is felt concerning RRECS has been

escalating for some time, and to date, I am not sure we have hit the crescendo. With seemingly little reason to remain patient, I am asking that we all tap into our secret source Zen and try see this of to unimaginably frustrating process through.

Quite frankly, this has been too much for some of us. Some of our more tenured brothers and sisters decided it was time to retire, some of our newer folks decided there were more promising opportunities elsewhere. Some in the middle of it all decided that it just wasn't worth it anymore. And then there are the rest of us, who for better or worse, are still waiting for the product that we were promised some 11 years ago.

I think it goes without saying that the quality of the

employment experience at the Postal Service as a rural carrier over the last decade has consistently declined. My travels across the state of North Carolina in the last three months revealed to me our common belief that things have never been this bad. And while I believe that every one of us should be fighting mad at the Postal Services' lack of commitment to the transparency and legitimacy of RRECS, now is not the time to throw in the towel. Keep fighting, for your route, for the craft, for your livelihood. Now, more than ever, for the sake of the future of the rural carrier craft, we must keep going.

I realize that this is not the first time I have written

about this, but we are literally in the home stretch of the final phase of implementation. While RRECS is not the only issue the rural carrier craft is facing, it certainly is the most prominent and collectively most impactful, and therefore, most consuming.

Your steward system here in North Carolina has been working day and night to help carriers with disputes and grievances. Making sure that the National Board is aware of the RRECS issues here in North Carolina. There are a few isolated issues, but the consensus is that North Carolina has the same issues as the entire country.

The National Board has compiled a list and specific examples shared by our carriers to continue to be our voice with USPS Leadership. I know we want to see explosive results from these meetings, but this is more of a 'chipping away' process.

The list of problems is extensive, but mainly the largest concern is that the composition of the evaluations is still not clear. Whether your route gained or lost, the method in which the Post Office got your evaluation is riddled with errors. Your National Board has kept in constant contact with Postal Headquarters, addressing each issue that has been brought to their attention.

If your route increased, I know you have been dismayed at the additional delays in implementation. But if you were part of the 66% of rural carriers whose route lost time, the delays are justified. It is imperative that every rural carrier be able to see the data that is used to determine their pay.

We are all getting impatient, but we must ensure that the data it is correct.

On a related note – no offices should be attempting to implement the Formula at this time. If your Postmaster is threatening the Formula, please reach out to your Area Steward or ADR if you don't have a local steward.

Since the glitches are still being worked out with RRECS, it would be improper to invoke the Formula without being certain of the offices' route classifications. Additionally, the existing rules are

still in effect – every Formula office must have the number of PTFs that is equal to 10% of the number of K routes in the office.

The Relief Day Work List should have been posted in your office from April 15th through April 28th, with an effective date of May 8th, 2023.

Signing your name to the RDWL entitles you to choose how you are paid for your relief-day work. Your choices are DACA R (a mutually agreed upon X day taken within 12 weeks of it being earned), DACA 3 (50% of your daily pay and an X day scheduled by management), or DACA 5 (150% of your daily pay only). If you choose to not sign the Relief Day Work List, your compensation for working your relief day can only be DACA 3.

With the arrival of spring, many of us are looking forward to taking leave. Remember that you should submit your leave slips no sooner than 60 days out from the first day of your anticipated leave period unless there are extenuating circumstances or a 'life event,' in which case you can submit with more notice. Leave should be approved by seniority (most senior person to submit each day) when there is a leave replacement available.

Hopefully we will see each other at the 2023 North Carolina RLCA State Convention in June. Until then, stay safe!

Procedure to File a Grievance

(See Example PS Form 8191 on next page)

You fill out the sections with red dots (# 1 - 4, except 3b & 3c). Management fills out the sections with the blue dots (#3b & 3c) when <u>you</u> actually file (discuss the issue) the grievance with them. (THIS DISCUSSION MUST BE WITHIN 14 DAYS FROM THE DATE IN 3a).

Once you have filed, let management make themselves a copy and you must get the original to the steward or representative immediately. The steward or representative **only has 10 days** from the date in 3b to setup a meeting with management.

Include a signed and dated statement telling your side of the issue. This statement is for the steward only. Management will not see your statement.

Never hesitate to call your steward or representative with questions if you need assistance. Never put your entire statement in #4 on the grievance form (PS Form 8191). Just state the issue in the form of a single question. Then, provide the steward with a statement explaining your side of the issue.

NOTE: Just filling out a grievance (PS Form 8191) and sending it to the steward or representative is NOT filing a grievance. You must discuss the issue with management at the time you are filing the grievance and follow the proper procedure.

Management must fill out sections 3b & 3c.
